





The Passion Flower

Many years ago, I was told a story about the flowers of this plant which connects it to Christ. In the 1600's Spanish Christian Missionaries in South America looked around for the presence of Christ, and found it in the beautiful flower of the passion flower. A climbing plant that now grows well in England.

It is also recorded that Roman Catholic priests used the flower to illustrate the story of the Crucifixion to the Indian Tribes they converted to Christianity.



The prominent colour of the flower is purple. The colour of the season of Lent.

The flower has 5 sepals and 5 petals remembering the ten apostles present with Jesus during his passion (Excluding Peter and Judas).

The prominent stigma, symbolizes the three nails that held Jesus to the cross.

The 5 anthers, the five wounds of Jesus (Hands, feet and side)

The numerous filaments being the crown of thorns.

While the plant produces leaves with three points – The Holy Trinity.

The vine or plant itself, reflecting God's attachment to the earth.

In praise of hedge laying

Early February, threw myself Ι enthusiastically into a hedge with a dashing stranger called Nick Warner and it turned out to be a memorable and bonding experience. We were paired up on a hedge laying course, hosted by Maria Spink at Colstrope Farm, led by Nigel Adams and with the additional support of his apprentice Jeff. The majority of hedges are cut back to the same height year upon year but over time a large percentage of the rootstock dies with little or no regeneration. Surveys on

England's remaining hedges have shown only between 12% and 48% are in good structural condition which has become a concern. Rather wonderfully, the centuries old art of hedge laying is gathering momentum again and fresh examples of varying excellence are crisscrossing forth across England's green and pleasant land. The skill initiates a new life cycle for the hedge by encouraging fresh growth from ground level. This in turn creates a stock proof barrier and at the same time is suddenly more beneficial to thousands of organisms from hedgehogs to micro moths and beetles of all sizes. Areas and/ or counties have different characteristics to their laid hedges and we come under the South of England style which is essentially a double brush, stakes spaced evenly along the centre and bindings. First, we had to untangle the mass of intertwining stems. Once one was free, with the aid of a whetstone sharpened billhook and taking into account the angle we wanted it to lie, the directive was to detach the stem from the majority of its base but ensuring some bark and sapwood remained attached. The stem is carefully laid across the central line of the hedge followed by some weaving in of the brash; and repeat. I found the hardest part was making a sharp point for the stakes. With a stake balanced against their thigh with one hand and clutching a billhook in the other, Jeff and Nigel were three or four slashes away from a sharp point. My attempts left a mess akin to something beavers might make felling a tree twenty times the diameter. The stakes are hammered into position with a beadle; a tool somewhat resembling an extra-large croquet mallet but crafted from a section of tree where a

suitable branch protrudes at a right-angle for a handle; very clever. Lastly, pliable hazel whips are woven around the stakes and a bow saw is used to cut the stakes off at the same height and at an angle which is very pleasing to the eye. It was a wonderful and hugely satisfying day and along with others, Nick and I made a small contribution to the welfare of local fauna. I forgot to photograph a billhook or a beadle either of which would of course be more useful at this point so instead I give you 'our' section of hedge which is the front cover picture of this magazine.

Fingest Past

World War II: The Home Front (1)

– During the Second World War a number of annual events were organized by the National Savings to raise funds for the war effort e.g., Wings for Victory (RAF), Salute the Soldier Week (Army) and Warship Week (Navy). Local authorities, villages, organisations etc., would hold a number of events to raise the money. Villages in the Hambleden Valley made their contribution. The following is taken from a publication called The Marlow Review

"Skirmett Women's Institute Group"

"To collect £750 (Ambulance) the villagers of Fingest, Turville and Skirmett are having four events of interest, a Garden fete* at 3p.m. on the 15^{th} (by kind permission of Mrs. Montefiore) the first for over 20 years in Fingest. A dance at 8.30 - 1 in Fingest on the 18^{th} (R.A.F. Band).

At Skirmett on the 20th, a Whist Drive and Auction and a Grand Concert to finish the week with, at Turville (7.30 p.m.). If the enthusiasm of the public is a gauge of their intention to save and spend, we shall do well."

*Held on the lawn at Tingehurst (now known as Fingest Manor), Chequers Lane, Fingest.

Frieth set a target of £2,000 for their Wings for Victory week. The committee organised a children's parade, a concert, whist drive, a dance and to end the week an auction sale "a number of surprises are promised at this function".

At Fawley Green the Army Mobile Unit arranged to show a newsreel followed by a film in the Village Hall. The village postmistress sold national saving stamps to gain entry instead of tickets. There was an afternoon sale with committee members each giving half a dozen articles. Also, some of the stores in Henley donated groceries and other goods for the sale The schoolmistress schoolchildren and made posters and notices. Does anyone remember making the posters? The Fawley Wings for Victory week ended with a whist drive.

At school we bought national savings stamps and attached them to a savings card. When our savings reached a certain amount, we received a card with a badge showing the sleeve rank slides of an officer in the service we had chosen. As the savings grew the higher the rank achieved e.g., my choice was the R.A.F; pilot officer, flying officer, flight lieutenant, squadron leader etc.

The war years I know little of. The Guttridge boys all survived. Ron served in the 8^{th} Army, Dad in the RAF, Arthur in the Navy.

After the war, Mr Bendir embarked on unsuccessful tax liability litigation, losing

heavily. Expenditure on the Abbey was reduced. Daughter Janine married American film director John Reed and they remained at the Abbey well into the 1950s.

In the village, veteran postmistress and Harry's distant cousin, Charlotte Sartin, had died during the war. But the village school remained in the capable hands of Miss West.

Medmenham after the war. However daughter Hilda Coleborn and family came to look after Harry and remained in Medmenham into the 1950s.


The 1947 floods were, if anything, worse than those of a decade earlier. Harry was reputedly brought out of Abbey Cottages by a 'duck' (DKW). But he stuck with the ferry into the 1950s. By then, dad had started a smallholding near St Albans.

As Grandad's health failed, he increasingly stayed with us there, I think he found it difficult sharing Abbey Cottages with daughter Hilda's young family.

On our visits to Medmenham, Grandad and I, the oldest and the youngest, were inseparable, often sitting together in his old sheds by the ferry.

Harry had been a strict father. But with us he mellowed. My mother could do no wrong in his eyes, I suspect because, as a nurse, she had helped Emily in her last years. And he doted on me. He showed me how to tie my laces, comb my hair, defended my misbehaviour even.

Strangely, what most sticks in my mind is the pungent smell of his "thick twist" tobacco. Carefully carved from the plug with a pruning knife, rubbed between the hands. Hard to find by then. Kept in a coil, wrapped around the tobacconist's hand, cut with a guillotine and sold by



the ounce, we walked miles to get it.

So, my last memories of him are like the photo, with pipe, flat cap and national health glasses, with that ghost of a smile he so often wore. Grandad died, like Mr Bendir, in 1957, in, as they used to say, the seventy ninth year of his age.

But that was not quite the end of our involvement with Medmenham. As I hope to explain in my next and final article.




