

eleven members of staff and over 200 volunteers who give up so much of their spare time from collecting and sorting food donations to packing food parcels and then delivering them to referred clients.

The onset of Covid in 2020 and the subsequent cost of living crisis has changed the dynamics of how the Food Bank is run. Pre Covid deliveries were being made to over 250 individuals, but recently this has increased to over 600, sometimes peaking at around 750, 45% of which are children. The higher volumes of clients combined with the higher cost of living created the "perfect storm" where lower food donations combined with higher demand imposed fresh challenges on the Food Bank. At times spending on food can be around £20k per month to satisfy demand and therefore there is a heavy reliance on grants received from Bucks Council as well as local grant funders, businesses, churches and individual donations, for which the Trust is eternally grateful.

However out of this adversity there have been some real positives not least of which has been the incredible support from the local community. Many of the local residents became Street Heroes by collecting food from friends and neighbours before dropping it off at the warehouse in Duke Street. To this day Street Heroes can be identified by the yellow boards outside their homes and generate 15% of our donated food. Weekend supermarket food drives are another vital source of donations where you will see volunteers proudly wearing their yellow branded One Can Trust T-shirts encouraging customer donations.

The scope of One Can has increased in recent months as the Trust tries to tackle other aspects of the poverty crisis. Volunteer calls are made by the Community Support team helping signpost clients to extra help, cookery classes are regular events especially during half term and school holidays at Hills, a community café in Micklefield which One Can supports, and a clothes bank has

been set up at the Wesley Church in High Wycombe.



All of this is possible only with the help of the amazing band of volunteers who give up so much to be the lifeline of the charity. It was therefore a huge boost recently when One Can received the Kings Award for Voluntary services in recognition of the community services it provides.

A Naturalist's Reminiscences No 3

I was a Suffolk boy born and bred, and I became a boarder at Ipswich School back in the Dark Ages. I never saw eye to eye with the headmaster. Since he had played cricket for Hampshire, he was not amused by me collecting butterflies on the boundary with my butterfly net. On the other hand, I was a reasonably good athlete particularly in cross country running after butterflies and any race longer than the 440 yds. To my chagrin he never showed any interest in athletics. So, when I became a school prefect I was shunted off to a new house in a guiet and leafy suburb of Ipswich. It had a large garden surrounded by a high wall. My new housemaster was Head of the Geography Department and kept an ancient donkey in the garden rescued from Felixstowe

beach. He knew about my interest in natural history and encouraged me to take other boys on bird watching expeditions to the Rivers Orwell and Stour. In the evenings he allowed me to sit on this high wall facing the street where there happened to be a convenient street light which attracted moths after dark. One warm evening I was busy collecting moths with my moth net when I was interrupted by a loud voice. "What dew yer be adoing on thet wall? Come yew down ere." It was the local constable doing his rounds so I showed him my moth boxes full of all sorts of lepidoptera. To my relief he showed no interest in arresting me but obviously he enjoyed seeing all the different species I had caught that evening. Next. he said "Oi be not busy ternoit so can Oi have a goe up there?" He proved a natural adept and much better than me in catching moths round that light. Our mothing became a regular weekly fixture on his rounds. He borrowed my moth books and soon became an expert on identifying different species.

I suggested that he might like to join the Suffolk Naturalists' Society which he promptly did. I then joined the Army for my National Service but I heard several years later, probably after he had retired, he had joined the Society's committee. If he had had the opportunity, he would have reached a high rank in the police force. My house master became Headmaster of Yarmouth Grammer School so look what natural history can do for you. For me it became an abiding interest.

Major George Howson MC 1886-1936

On Tuesday, 28th November at 12 noon in Pheasants Hill Cemetery, 12 people gathered including Andrew MacTavish, Chairman of Royal British Legion Lane End, for the annual wreath laying by Mark Young from The Poppy Factory, together

with Revd. Sue Morton leading the prayers and reading Psalm 121 "I lift up my eyes to the hills".

George Howson would have seen those hills in the Hambleden Valley where he used to live. His legacy of opening The Poppy Factory in 1922 continues forever more, making millions of poppies, supporting the armed forces, veterans, and their families. At the bottom of his headstone there is a cross with a hand and a poppy upon it and the word "FULFILMENT".

Indeed, 2 years ago there was a request to have this humble man's achievement recognized with a stone plaque in St. Mary the Virgin Church, Hambleden. This has now been approved and £4,000 is needed so that, hopefully, it can be in place for Remembrance 2024 next November.

Let us try and FULFILL this obligation to a remarkable man, who lived and is buried in our Hambleden Valley and in whom we can be justly proud.

The Stag & Huntsman will relaunch in January 2024 with a new Michelin-starred chef and revamped rooms with Sika Inns having picked up the reins.




