

She knew she was an accomplished organist already, having been cycling to Purley-on-Thames to practise playing the church organ since she had grown long enough to reach the pedals!

She applied for the post and was thrilled to start a life-long career directing music for Hambleden, Frieth, and beyond. 67 happy years have passed with her leading the choir and filling the Valley with heavenly anthems, during which she has achieved and received a variety of accolades. Here is a photo of her receiving her "British Empire Medal" from the Lord Lieutenant of Buckinghamshire in 2013. You probably know, she eschews the limelight!

It has been a great but brief pleasure for me to meet and befriend our wonderful Christine and



stories about her abound. It seems everyone has been in her choir and all are proud to say so! Sadly, I now find myself conducting funerals for old choir members and their families and there is only one person they request to play at the service.

Last month Christine's own article explained she has reached the point of stepping down as Director of Music. Time waits for no one. Yet we look forward to a joyous "Christine Choral Evensong" on Palm Sunday, 24th March, when she shall play pieces and settings of her choosing and be presented with the title Organist Emeritus, allowing her to continue to play on an ad hoc basis as she steps down as Director. Do join us then.

And Christine, may I take these pages to thank you sincerely, on behalf of all of my 8 predecessors you have worked with, all the choirs down the ages, all the parishioners and their families, for your dedication, expertise, commitment, patience, energy, excellence and service over these near seven decades!



A special prayer written by The Bishop of Oxford, the Rt Revd Dr Steven Croft, was said at all our services the following day and the family, Lucy his wife, their five children and all the extended family were remembered in our intercessions. Our bishop since 2003, Alan Wilson was loved and appreciated by so many and will be acutely missed. He was at the start of a well-earned and long overdue sabbatical and was planning to retire in only two years. Bishop Steven's tribute



includes: "He has offered remarkable leadership to our work in education and church schools over more than a decade. Alan has been a friend and advocate for survivors of abuse and a strong ally and supporter

of the LGBTQIA+ community for many years." The Archdeacon of Buckingham, the Ven Guy Elsmore, added: "We have lost a courageous, wise and exceptional pastoral leader and teacher. Alan's ministry was centred in people, in valuing every person he met and in the quest to expand the circle of the Church's love to embrace all. He will be deeply missed by us all."



The Deanery Wild Lent Pilgrimage 11th February 2024 hosted by the Hambleden Valley Wild Church



We finally arrived at the cross in Hambleden churchyard and heard Jesus's words: "Come to Me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest." We were not physically all that weary, but we were glad of the cuppa and scrumptious cakes generously provided for us. Some had come "burdened" with backpacks containing First Aid kit, or water bottle, or waterproofs, or emergency rations for the kids, or even the you-knowwhat for the dog!



Earlier we'd set off from Skirmett, and heard how Jesus sent his disciples out with nothing for their journey: no bread, no money, no spare shirt, but I didn't notice anybody putting stuff back in their cars! Our lifestyle is easy: we don't gladly accept hardship. Yet Lent is the time we remember Jesus being sent into the wilderness to be tempted for 40 days: that is hardship.

A gentle stroll down the soft green valley parallel to the Hambleden Brook: not exactly wild-erness, even if organised by Wild Church! But every half mile or so, we stopped to let everyone catch up, then hear a few words of scripture and a brief challenge from one of the ministers, and sing a verse or two from *My Song is Love Unknown*. Everyone listened intently, including the children and the dogs! Though the children did have clipboards with activities specially for them.



Some prayed as they walked; some talked to old friends and new friends; some noted yet another robin every 100 yards or so, singing and marking his territory, or tried counting the hundreds of molehills, or pondered the leafless blackthorn just beginning its 5-petalled starlet flowers. All enjoyed the tale of the topiary worm gobbling all but the wellies. We were thankful for the excellent organisers and planners, and they and we were thankful for a dry and mild day.

At the end of it all we thanked the Lord for a lovely day out and a great start to Lent. All that's left is to put into practice what we experienced, and that will be the challenge!

Henley Toad Patrol 2024

It was migrating mayhem last night beside the Marlow Road. There were astonishing scenes along the length of the toad barrier which was erected by Henley Toad Patrol at the end of January. Hundreds of toads emerged from Culden Faw woods, were gently gathered by volunteers into buckets and taken safely across the A4155 to their spawning pond. Muddy, wet individuals and I am talking about the volunteers here, ran a taxi service for amphibians from dusk until 00.45am. More sleepy souls (humans) arrived on site at 6.15am to fill further bucketloads of creatures who had reached the barrier in the early hours. Professor John Sumpter collated all the volunteers' tallies and has declared 14th February 2024 as the busiest night since records began 25 years ago with a grand total of 3035.

A Naturalist's Reminiscences No.5

My Basic Training at the Northampton Regiment's Depot was a doddle since I had done it all in the CCF (Combined Cadet Force) at school. The RSM (Regimental Sergeant Major) made me Best Recruit for the Passing Out Parade. However, by then my Commanding Officer had decided that I might make a suitable officer and sent me off to WOSBY (War Office Selection Board) in Dorset. En route I had to stay at Woolwich Arsenal. The barracks had a huge dormitory full of empty steel beds. On arrival I was given a small slip of paper to certify that '23379868

HAMBLEDEN

Pte Waller' had drawn out a straw palliasse i.e. a straw mattress. I didn't sleep a wink.

The following morning, I continued on to Dorset where I had three days of tests. On my crucial 'Command Test', I was given a large heavy barrel, ropes and wooden poles with which to get this barrel over a mythical stream. Unfortunately, the barrel collapsed into the middle of the stream. On being asked by the supervising Major what I would then do, I responded 'Get the hell out quickly'. I realised immediately that perhaps that might not be the required answer. Fortunately, the Major had a sense of humour and at the end of the tests he handed me another small slip of paper indicating that I was a suitable candidate for officer training.

On return to Northampton, the RSM was not amused.
