Group Letter

There are times when the rhythm of our lives is interrupted and sometimes those interruptions are opportunities for us to grow: to learn something new about ourselves, about others, about God.

You may have noticed that the church in Turville is now closed for six months of conservation work; the regular rhythm of Wednesday services that have been held there for many years has been interrupted,

caused us to pause and given us the opportunity to reflect on where we are.

Preparing for this pause on the final Wednesday led us to holding a simple service of blessing in the church. In some ways the preparation had felt rather like the overwintering of a National Trust stately home: hymn books stowed away in dust free zones; vases moved to places of safety; the organ shrouded from top to bottom.

But while the outside of the church is now surrounded by hoarding, at that March service there was something deeper taking place. We enfolded the church in God's blessing: blessing each other and thanking God for the years of Wednesday services held there as we stood together on holy ground; blessing the faithful Wednesday morning people whom we love but see no longer; blessing the inside of the church and all who would enter it over the coming months, that their labours would be a blessing to themselves and to us.

This change of rhythm, this interruption, had caused us to pause and reflect and the time of blessing felt important preparation for this period of closure.

I am reminded of the constant change of rhythm and the interruptions that Jesus experienced on his journey to Jerusalem. It is through those interruptions that we meet many of the people of the Gospels, hear their stories and receive encouragement for ourselves.

The change in rhythm to the Wednesday morning services at Turville has already brought about blessings by the warmest of welcomes from Fingest Church, where we now meet at the usual time of 10.15am.

Do join us if you're able to!



Footprints Service



Well, it's Sunday afternoon, and Ferry Lane is hushed. The only sign of life is the line of cars nestled by the church wall, hinting at something special within. And special it is, indeed.

I take a deep breath and head towards the church, steps hesitant. It's one of those moments where you feel your heart might just crack wide open if you're not careful. Footprints, they call this service. For those who've lost a child during pregnancy or at any stage of life, or for those whose hearts ache alongside them.



Sunshine finds its way through the porch, landing in a bright pool next to this extraordinary tree... an art installation, dreamt up by dear Revd. Sue. A slender tree made of light, adorned with a hundred candles. There are cards too, holding prayers– to help you pause and reflect. Paper footprints are offered, space for names, or prayers, or even just a whisper to someone desperately missed.

We place our candles on the altar, a line of soft lights under the stained glass. Children everywhere, Jesus right there among them. Just as it should be.

"One night I dreamed I was walking along the beach with the Lord (...) I noticed footprints in the sand.

Sometimes there were two sets of footprints, other times there was only one set of footprints (...) Why, when I needed you most, have you not been there for me?

The Lord replied,

When you saw only one set of footprints, it was then that I carried you."

(from Footprints prayer)

A few quiet sobs now, then Kerri begins to sing, and her voice washes over us, gentle and soothing.

The tree of lights flickers to life, and Sue invites us to choose a candle that speaks to us of our loved ones.

"You were made with such love," the Psalm tells us. Sometimes that feels impossibly hard to believe, doesn't it? But those candles, they burn fiercely within this old church, steeped in prayers and sorrow. And those words from Corinthians, about love outlasting everything else... well, that's a truth to hold onto, isn't it?



St Mary the Virgin Turville Conservation Project

On Tuesday March 11th a village meeting was held to inform parishioners of the details of our planned conservation work beginning on Monday March 18th. The meeting was attended by around 20 people and many helpful questions were asked and answered.

work will address the This gradual deterioration in the building over the last decade as well as correcting some wellmeant but unhelpful repairs from the past. The project has three principal components: repairing the tower which has suffered from water ingress, refurbishing the roof and rain goods and addressing various issues with the external walls, in particular removing cementitious render and replacing it with mixed lime mortar. We will also be rewiring the church and refurbishing the WC which is in a very poor state.

It will mean the church is, sadly, closed for 6 months but is scheduled to reopen in September.

The Wednesday 10.15am communion service will move temporarily to Fingest church, and an outdoor Easter Day communion service in Turville is planned.

Pam had grown up in Fawley, where her mother ran the village post office. She moved to Turville with her husband Len, living first in St Mary's Cottages and then Square Close, and played a full part in the life of the village community. Pam loved her family, friends and spending time working in her wonderful garden. She was caring, open-hearted and had a great sense of fun. She also had a steely determination and mastered new skills throughout her life: learning to drive in her 70s, and to use a mobile phone, i-pad and Zoom in her 80s and 90s.

Pam worked as a dinner lady at Turville School, playing an important role in the lives of children from across the Hambleden Valley. Many of them still recall how she insisted that they ate everything that the school cooks, Peggy Bird and Peggy Wanless, had put on their plates. In Pam's last few years, the favour was returned and, thanks to the help of friends from the valley and beyond, Pam was able to live independently in her own home until just a few days before she died. Rosie and Kathy Rosier, Brian Deacon, Anne Jones and the Bull and Butcher - among others - all played their part. They, like us, will miss her very much: Pam was such an important part of the mutual support network that makes this valley such a special community. But Pam will, of course, live on in the many episodes of The Vicar of Dibley in which she appeared as a photogenic film 'extra'!
