We have just moved into the Rectory. I hate moving house! Don't we all? A neighbour said "that's why we are in the same house after 44 years!" It is another reason we should be grateful to those families in the services. All that was ordered and sorted, understood and familiar, is turned upside down.

Change is hard for us all. The Conservatives have a head start politically with their very name - we want to conserve what we have. We want to build slowly from where we are, we don't want revolution, life turned upside down.

Yet we must embrace change. It is a natural part of our lives. We are happy to see the seasons change. Perhaps particularly so at this time of year, with nature at its most colourful and verdant, seeing Spring turn to Summer, with all the hope it brings. Change is inevitable. With change we have the ups as well as the downs, in my case the baptisms and weddings as well as the funerals. Life has to change.

Christine Wells, Sunday 24th March 2024 Hambleden





A very special service was held on Sunday 24th March for a very special person. Christine Wells. The Director of Music for the Hambleden Valley Churches for 67 years. Christine retired at the end of March and was given a new title of Organist Emeritus. The service of thanksgiving took the format of a Choral Evensong in Hambleden church. This showcased the considerable talents of Christine herself. and also attracted a large congregation of people from far and wide wanting to express their thanks for the outstanding contribution she has made to community life and enriched the musical world for so many people.



It was an Evensong which Christine herself had arranged; simple, meaningful and, above all, full of music echoing through the centuries. Everything was as it should be with Christine seated at the organ, guiding the choir which she had trained, supporting the congregation which included former choristers, clergy and creating a true

reflection of the role of music in the work of the church. The centuries old liturgy followed and the overall atmosphere was of a community thankful that a young, talented organist chose, all those years ago, to spend her lifetime's work enriching the life of our local churches and communities rather than heading for the heights of cathedral life!

A presentation was made to Christine by the Archdeacon of Buckinghamshire, the Ven. Guy Elsmore and a vice-president of the Guild of Church Musicians, June Williams

After the service the choir surprised the new Organist Emeritus with a performance of *Thank you for the Music* with alternative lyrics (apologies to Abba). This had been rehearsed secretly in Medmenham church before the usual choir practice in Hambleden much to Christine's astonishment and delight.

Thank you, Christine, for all your loving care and for all your unseen work - the selection and rehearsing of music, all the admin for the choir, the practising in freezing churches in all weathers through thick and thin and, most importantly, for your love of music which has been shared with others.

Maundy Thursday

In an atmospheric candlelit room, a long table was beautifully laid. Our hands were washed and dried by Revd Andy Storch and Revd Sue Morton before we began our meal. Revd Andy had before him a Seder Plate which is the focal point of the Jewish Passover Seder meal. Revd Andy talked about the ingredients on the Plate, which are symbolic of the retelling of the Passover for the Jewish community. There is the karpas, a leafy vegetable such as parsley or celery, which is dipped in salt water at the

The 25 volunteers are like modern-day disciples, selflessly tending to this corner of God's work. It's truly inspiring.







A Naturalist's Reminiscences No.6

Having completed Basic Training at the Northampton Regiment, I was posted to Eaton Hall, the official residence of the Duke of Westminster just outside Chester. It had been requisitioned by the War Office as an Army Officer Cadet School.

I found myself sharing a 4th floor maids' bedroom with another cadet from the Welsh Fusiliers who became a lifelong friend and now lives in Basingstoke. Clive from Wales was still an innocent country boy and never suspected that the walking stick under my bed was actually a real shooting stick which could take one 12 bore cartridge at a time. The estate was well stocked with game and several gamekeepers. They started to complain to the CO that they believed a cadet had been poaching the Duke's pheasants. There was a club in Chester where cadets could meet pretty girls - they seemed to appreciate a brace of pheasants. The pheasants were also useful elsewhere, as one morning shortly before the final rehearsal of the Passing Out Parade I had a PE session and then had to dash up all those stairs to change into full parade uniform. Just as I was marching onto the drill square under the supervision of RSM Lynch, Irish Guards, I realised I had left my bayonet in my room. I had to pretend I was doing all the movements for Fixed Bayonets. At the end of the parade, since I had received no reprimand from the RSM, I thought I had got away with it. Suddenly, a roar "That dozy cadet in the back rank, report to my office immediately". Visions of many extra drill sessions came to mind. A brace of pheasants was duly hung on his door and no more questions were asked.

A brass statue of Hugh Lupus, an ancestor of the Duke, sitting on his horse, commanded

the drill square. I and a couple of other cadets decided to fill the horse full of water and put a bung in an appropriate place. At the start of the parade the horse seemed to have a massive call of nature which continued throughout the event. My father, who was a country parson, and my mother had come to see me pass out and they thought it was all part of the parade. By then Clive was more suspicious.
