## **Group Letter**

One of the joys of rural ministry is the variety of events and services that take place throughout the year, many of which carry their own unfolding stories, touching us both locally and nationally. Take June, for example. This month we have the opportunity to celebrate the  $175^{\text{th}}$  anniversary of the consecration of Frieth Church on 5th June.

And then on 6th June the nation will commemorate the 80th anniversary of the D-Day Landings, described as the 'largest seaborne invasion in history.' Perhaps surprisingly, despite being a long way from the sea, the D-Day Landings also touched the people of the Hambleden Valley on a local level.

Local families have shared stories of 1944 when, along either side of the Avenue in Turville Heath, dugouts were created to train soldiers. That long straight stretch of road, lined with trees, replicated French roads.

I wonder how many people took refuge in our ancient churches as a result of that day, to give thanks to God or to seek his comfort and compassion.

While we reflect on those stories that link with our past, we have the privilege of being part of new stories as June heralds a sprinkling of weddings in our churches, with couples starting a fresh chapter in their lives and new anniversaries in the making. And many a proposal is made in the beautiful surroundings of the Valley on that journey to the marriage service!

And what about us? What are the stories that are, or have been, or will be unfolding in our lives? Wherever we are in our journey, our churches continue to offer a refuge where everyone is warmly welcome to slip inside - or to join us at a service - and to surround themselves with those ancient prayer-soaked walls; here there is a sense of the God who loves each one of us, and who will continue to lovingly hold our own unfolding stories of our past, our present and our future in the palm of his hand.

Wild Church Celebrates World Milk Day!



DID YOU KNOW THAT WORLD MILK DAY is an annual event established by the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) of the United Nations to raise awareness and highlight the significance of milk as a vital food source worldwide?



So! Where would you go to celebrate dav? this Whu Lacey's Farm in Lane End of course! Six generations of Laceys have farmed in Lane End since the 1880s, specialising in Guernsey cattle since the 1930s.

So, Wild Church celebrated this event at the farm on 12th May, together with 32 adults and 9 children.



Sue Morton opened the afternoon in the orchard with an explanation of what we would see, then a prayer and hymn with support from the Wild Choir. Gid Lacey continued to tell us briefly about the farm and explained



that the cows had to be pregnant to produce the milk; we were then led through the fields overlooking the Valley where Fingest Church nestles, with a skylark flying high overhead singing to us. In one field there were cows getting ready to be milked, which coincided nicely with our return to the farm. The cows were very aware of what they had to do – two rows of ten all standing neatly facing a little feeding trough while the cow's udders and the milk clusters were cleaned and then fitted to the cows. It took no time at all, and the cows knew exactly when the job was finished! The





cows followed each other out of the milking parlour and back to the field. All very civilised! Gid explained to me that occasionally milking didn't go to plan and that was why he was occasionally late for the Wednesday Zoom Service, Quite understandable. Each cow is milked twice a day and produces about 6,500 litres of milk annually which is then bottled and either sold in the farm shop or goes to local cheese makers.

#### A Naturalist's Reminiscence No.7

Just before I passed out of Eaton Hall Officer Cadet School in Chester, the War Office indicated that there was a requirement for an attachment to the British Gurkhas in India and Nepal as a Recruiting Officer. They should have stipulated that this posting was for Regular rather than National Service officers.

Since the Suffolk Regiment was serving in Germany, a country I already knew, I felt the India and Nepal posting was much more interesting. Another more cogent reason was that the CO (Commanding Officer) of Eaton Hall was investigating damage to the anatomy of Hugh Lupus's brass horse together with complaints from the Duke of Westminster's gamekeepers of poaching allegedly by an officer cadet.

I thought a language qualification would be useful but I didn't know what the Gurkhas spoke. It might be a variant of Hindi. So, on the Friday before the Monday interview I nipped into Chester to one of the oldest bookshops in the UK to enquire whether the bookseller had any books on Hindi? 'Oh, no sir', he said 'I do not have much call for them since the end of the British Raj'. Obviously, I must have looked very disappointed so he invited me to come into his display room at the back.

There were book shelves up the walls stacked with volumes coated in dust. I remember him saying 'you take that shelf and I'll take this shelf' and in no time we found a book of Hindi exercises and a Hindi dictionary. I spent the entire weekend swotting up the language. On the Monday there was nobody there who could speak Gurkhali so I added a few Urdu words for good measure.

If I secured the posting I knew I was entitled to a 3-week embarkation leave so I could learn whatever they spoke in Nepal. They kept asking me whether I was sure I wanted this posting to which I responded in the affirmative so I was offered it with the proviso that I was required out there immediately. So, a week later I arrived in Calcutta.

In my next reminiscence I will describe my travel up to tiger territory in Nepal.







#### **MEDMENHAM**

#### **Medmenham Camp Iron Age Hill Fort**

The following is taken from an information board in Gillman's Wood, Medmenham. If anyone knows more about this, please let me know. Penny McLeish (Editor).


In 2004, Archaeology in Marlow (now part of Marlow Archaeological Society) successfully applied for a grant from the Local Heritage Initiative, through the Heritage Lottery Fund, to survey for local earthworks. One of which was Medmenham Iron Age Hill Fort.

Medmenham Hill Fort is known as Medmenham Camp or Gillman's (Guilleman's) Wood. In mediaeval times there was a Chantry Priest who lived in a building within the Fort, a Guilleman or hermit. The Hill Fort dates from the Iron Age between 2,000 and 2,700 years ago. In 1959



a knife blade, believed to be Bronze Age in date (2,700 to 700) years ago, was found on the south-west rampart.

The earthwork is roughly pear-shaped and occupies an area approximately 6.5 hectares. Its height varies from 100 to 125m above sea level and it stands about 25m above the floodplain of the River Thames below. The earthwork consists of a substantial rampart or bank running round the west, north and east flanks of the Hill Fort, although the east flank has almost been ploughed out over the millennia. At the north-west corner of the Hill Fort a second rampart can be seen adding to Fort's defences.



A profile was taken here with the dotted line indicating the probable heights and depths of the original banks and ditches, as well as a wooden palisade which would have probably been constructed upon the inner bank improving the defensive capabilities.

The southern face of the Hill Fort is a chalk cliff which rises from the floodplain of the river below.

Iron Age Hill Forts seem to have several uses. Some contained grain stores, some had settlements or might have been trading posts or toll stations, while others showed no signs




of habitation at all. Their roles appear to be defensive or protective.

The tribe which occupied this area before the Roman invasion were the Catuvellauni. The tribe which occupied the south side of the Thames were the Atrebates. Therefore, the Fort may have defended the frontier of the Catuvellauni's territory. Medmenham Camp is situated very close to Danesfield Camp another Hill Fort. The close proximity of these two structures may be coincidental as they may have been active in totally different periods within the 700 years of the Iron Age.

Between 2005 and 2008, Archaeology in Marlow investigated this site. As the Hill Fort is a Scheduled Monument, Archaeology in Marlow was not permitted to conduct excavation work so a plan of noninvasive action was devised which included the gathering of research information, profiling, dowsing, plus theodolite and laser level surveying.

One of their tasks, was to try to locate a Norman castle built for Hugh de Bolebec. The map above is reproduced from a book written in 1958 by the Reverend Arthur Plaisted entitled *The Romance of a Chiltern Village.* Although Plaisted's map shows the castle and the castle's keep, despite extensive investigations, neither were located. However, a possible Iron Age enclosure (in red) and a probable dew pond (in blue) were recorded.
