Group Letter



'How's the commute going, Sue?' asked one of my neighbours one Wednesday morning as I headed half a mile down the road from Turville to Fingest for the midweek service, Turville church being closed for conservation work.

As someone who used to commute to London daily - with the challenges of cancelled trains because of 'leaves on the line' or the 'wrong kind of snow' - commuting (if you can even call it that!) around the villages of the Hambleden Valley is an absolute joy! One of the many things that I notice on my travels is the creative ways that villages find to get together to support each other and our churches.

For example, in Turville, while the church is closed, people are getting together in the churchyard on Saturday mornings to create a Community Patchwork Tapestry to hang in the church on its reopening. The tapestry squares are being designed and stitched by the young and not-so-young, by those who live near and not-so-near, with a pause for some simple prayers interwoven into the sewing session.

Then in Hambleden churchyard there is tea and cake each summer Sunday afternoon while Fingest has its own church teas on Sunday 25th August, plus the much-loved annual outdoor service on Sunday 4th August at 10am.

In Fawley, people gather for Friday noon prayers in the churchyard, which was such a blessing while the church was closed; in Medmenham, on third Sundays, the Village Service continues to take place at 11am, followed by inviting refreshments! And Frieth flings open its doors to welcome in the School, and often parents, for several services throughout the year; the result is that children feel at home in its pews or confident standing at the front to speak.

So, I wonder how good are you at commuting? Could you jump in the car, walk, cycle, ride your horse to another village to join in with something new or to try a different church service? It's a great way to share ideas and support and, in August at least, there shouldn't be leaves on the line or the wrong kind of snow!



A Naturalist's Reminiscence No.9

When I finally reached Phusri in Nepal, once again I inherited a leaking tent. The War Office had decided it should be a temporary camp for the small contingent of Gurkha officers. There were two Recruiting Officers of which I was one: two Pension Paving Officers whose prime function was to tour Nepal with large sums of money to pay the pensions of retired British Gurkhas and a Lieutenant Colonel who was our CO. When I arrived the War Office seemed to have forgotten our existence and we were forced to 'live off the land' for several months. We persuaded our CO to become 'Gardens Officer' and grow or purchase vegetables and to obtain fresh fruit at the local bazaar. I managed to purchase an Indian equivalent of a 12 bore shot gun and my primary function was to shoot wild game venison, ducks, Jungle Fowl etc until the War Office remembered where we were.

The camp overlooked the Kosi River which carried fresh water from the Himalayas. Local deer and even tigers regularly came there to drink. A tall clump of reeds some 15ft tall conveniently overlooked the river and provided a good site to shoot passing duck and other river birds. One day I was squatting there with my Gurkha batman behind me loading my shot gun when some large animal approached us through the



dwindled and the difficulty of maintaining it, it is now a sheep field.

The Stumblebums originally were a nomadic side with a distinct medical flavour, gathered together by Paul Smith, a surgeon, who used to live at Kimble Farm. Post matches at Fawley were initially celebrated at the Walnut Tree (which subsequently lay derelict for over 20 years and then burnt down in 2023). After its closure we had to go down the hill to The Rainbow at Middle Assendon which I believe is currently up for sale.
