It has none of the collective anticipation, none of the licentious partying, none of the fiscally irresponsible gift giving - at least not in my household. Eid falls on a random weekday, so you nip home for 24 hours painfully conscious of normal life carrying on without you, and stuff your face with biryani while hoping for £20 off your grandad. It's not the same."

Therefore, I keep this picture at my place at meal-times to remind me of all the joys of Christmas, to keep my Scrooge affectations hidden, and to embrace all the festivities, those inside and outside the churches!

Have a Christmas season full of joy, cheer, fun and as much excess as you wish!



Wild Remembrance

Under gentle intermittent showers of beautiful golden leaves, a small crowd gathered. With the leafy ground beneath us uneven and undulating - presumably because of the century-old trench works we were standing on - it gave an almost amphitheatre effect to us all being able to see Rev Sue next to the poppy-strewn table and display of photos and letters from long ago soldiers writing home. We learnt about one of these soldiers, John 'Charlie' Hold, 5th Battalion, Oxfordshire and Buckinghamshire Light Infantry, with Rev Sue and Mark reading out his letters helping us to picture his life, starting with his call-to-duty in 1915. Charlie's letters were mostly to his mum, his family, including his sisters, trying to tell them he was doing ok, and occasionally sending socks and vests home to be washed and returned. We felt we were getting to know this young man. so when Rev Sue said "And this is Charlie's last letter" I think most people had a lump in their throats.

We then heard from Adam Knights, representing the Paratrooper Regiment who said that what stood out for him from hearing the letters was Charlie trying to convince his mum he was ok, he wasn't in danger and he wasn't scared. He explained that in truth all

of them would have been terrified, without exception. He then expressed how pleased he was to see so many people gathered there today to remember those who have died. He himself had seen friends die in front of him in similar circumstances so it was a comfort to know that people think of them. When I spoke to my 10-year-old after the event, this is what stood out for him the most - he expressed surprise that British Soldiers are still dying in wars today. This started a whole series of questions from him about war that unfortunately have no answer, but are important to keep asking nonetheless.

Paratrooper Adam then told us more about trenches and how they have been used over the years in different combats and are still used today, it all depends on the weapons and the level of defence built up against the latest ones - or lack of. He said no one likes digging a trench (especially paratroopers) until they are being shot at, at which point it seems the best idea in the world and you speed up pretty quickly.

The beautifully played 'Last Post' by Bobby Howard-Jones saw us into a moving two-minute silence, and after *Jerusalem* there was much chatter about the experience we had all just had, what we had learnt, and how good the cake was. The children all ran off to play 'tag' and 'hide and seek' in the trenches, which seems relatively fitting given they were made for hiding anyway, but this time for more cheerful reasons. All made possible thanks to the efforts of those who

dug them in the first place, and what they went on to achieve in the war 110 years ago.




